Gray Wolf Season Pass Information

Membership Dues

Gray Wolf membership dues must be paid on or before August 15th for your name to appear on the Gray Wolf Membership List. Keep in mind, to receive your daily lift ticket at Base Camp, you must be a member of Gray Wolves and purchase a Gray Wolf season pass, not a Senior season pass.

Season Pass Sale

The season pass sale will begin Saturday, September 24th and will end on Sunday, October 2, 2016. After October 2nd prices go up 25% so be sure to purchase your pass during the sale dates. Gray Wolf season passes can only be purchased over the phone, by mail and at the Wolf Creek Ticket Office because we must verify the membership status of every Gray Wolf. Office hours are 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Do not purchase a Senior season pass online if you are a member of Gray Wolves. A Senior season pass and a Gray Wolf season pass are not the same; the Senior season pass is slightly more expensive and does not include the advantage of picking up your daily lift ticket at Base Camp.

Silver Pin Requirements

To receive the Gray Wolf Silver Pin, Gray Wolf members must purchase a Gray Wolf season pass for the three years prior to turning 80. If you are not a member of the Gray Wolf Ski Club and purchase a Senior season pass for the three years prior to turning 80, you will not qualify for the Gray Wolf Silver Pin.
