2025 Membership Information

As of April 2025, the Gray Wolf Ski Club is 1,190 members strong!

The **annual membership renewal** period for the **2025 -2026** season runs **from April 15 to August 15, 2025**. Anyone over 50 is eligible to become a Gray Wolf!

- · Annual membership dues, reduced by \$5 for 2025, allow members discounted season ski pass rates for those age 65+, and for those meeting the Wolf Creek Ski Area grandfathered clause issued in August 2023.
- ·Members who have been Gray Wolf Ski Club members for the previous 3 or more consecutive years as they turn 80 years of age or older can apply for their membership at no annual charge, however, they must renew membership as lifetime members each year.
- · Additional benefits include:
 - Members can participate in many outdoor and social event opportunities as well as discounted luncheons at Wolf Creek Ski Area.
 - Local business discounts listed on the Gray Wolf Ski Club website are available to members. Members receive a group email for password access to the local business discount and membership lists.



Update on Japan 2026

"Thank you for all of you have expressed an interest in the proposed Japan Ski Trip. We are getting closer to finalizing. Anticipated cost for the two-week trip will be around \$5,500.00 per person, double occupancy. The departure day will be around January 27th, 2026 (depending on availability of flights). The basic trip will include airfare from Durango to Tokyo. Transfers and three-night stay in Tokyo, transportation to Hakuba, in the Japanese Alps. Accommodation in Hakuba, six days of skiing in Hakuba. At least one optional day of sightseeing for the snow monkeys and shrines. Transportation to Kyoto and three nights accommodation in Kyoto. Two days of tours of Kyoto. Transfers back to Tokyo and the flight back to Durango. For those that want to have more skiing we will price a trip that takes out the Kyoto portion and goes to Hokkaido (Niseko). This will require flying from Tokyo to New Chitose Airport. This is an internal Japan flight, and you will be responsible for making those flight reservations yourself. The club can book the hotels. The trip will include all breakfasts and possibly some dinners. A \$300.00 nonrefundable deposit will be required to secure your booking. Likely you will need to decide within 10 days of the release of the itinerary to secure your participation in the trip. Those that wish to make their own flight reservations you are welcome to do so. Make sure you coordinate with the standard itinerary as much as possible. In the event of any disruption of your flights it will be up to you to catch up with the group.
